Alan Hawkins has run AJ Welding in Wimbledon for the last 25 years. He loves his work and said that his job is rarely dull because it's so diverse.

When I took this shot, he'd just made a cool, gothic-looking pull-up bar for a friend who was a veteran of the war in Afghanistan. The guy was a bomb disposal expert and was left disabled after one exploded on him. Alan's pull-up bar will help his friend keep fit. Alan was also commissioned to use his welding skills to create four 15 ft steel horses for an international polo tournament, which he says was an incredible experience. Much of his work is smaller scale though. Alan said that he's one of the only welders around who will do smaller jobs, and he loves to use his welding skills to fix things as he detests waste.

Several of his customers are local Indian restaurant owners that come in asking him to re-weld handles back onto pots and pans. He said he finds this satisfying as they'd be thrown away otherwise.

It was hard to take a shot of Anabela. Her shop 'ana bela's' in Tooting Market was so busy. There was a constant stream of people coming in wanting an item of clothing altered or repaired. In the short time I was there, I saw a guardsman who needed an adjustment to his uniform, a guy who had ripped a brand new glove, and somebody whose jackets had frayed sleeves. Anabel said she could repair them all. She trained as a tailor back in Portugal and spent several years working for the fashion brand, Pierre Cardin. She still makes clothes and recently made an unveiling cloth for a new residential care home in Putney that was opened by the Queen. Anabela clearly loves her job and told me that she gets a great deal of pleasure from repairing an item that a customer loves too much to replace. I finally managed to take a shot, and as I left, Anabel said, "I love the people I work with, and I love making my customers happy."

Ashley showed me some before and after photos of shoes that Dunnes have repaired over the years. Lots of the before shots showed footwear that dogs and foxes had chewed. To me, they looked destroyed, but in the after photos, they looked as good as new. Ashley said that business is good, but they don't get as many shoe repairs as they used to. "People just throw damaged or worn shoes away. It's a shame because more often than not, we can repair them; we love the challenge.

The person in charge of the market really looks after all the different shop owners and there's a real sense of community.

Ghazala is married to a solicitor and, now that her kids are older, has managed to find the time to take several evening classes in flower arrangement, card making, sewing and business studies at South Thames College. Her dream is to be a fashion designer.

Riz came to Britain from Pakistan in 1999 to marry an English girl. It was an arranged marriage, and Riz told me that 22 years later, he and his wife are both very happy. He loves living in Britain – even the weather. His wife used to work in Sainsbury's in Balham, but now she stays at home to look after their daughters, aged 11 and 13.

Covid has had a terrible effect on Riz's business. He'd been allowed to stay open during the pandemic but he's lost at least 70% of his trade. Most people who live around his shop are office workers who regularly came in to get their suits, shirts, and blouses laundered for work. These customers are now working from home so they don't use Riz's shop as much. Riz has spent all his savings trying to keep the business going. He said that this is a tough time, but he remains optimistic that things will get better. If you need any dry cleaning or alterations, pop in to see Riz, you can't miss him; he'll be sitting in the window, as always, behind that sewing machine.

Roberts Bespoke Tailoring photographed by Amy Adams



The premises at 10 Selkirk Road has always been the site of tailoring establishments. The first tailor opened in1886 and a large amount of his work was to make the uniforms for the Merchant Navy docked at Southampton. These specialist tailors were known as "merchant tailors" – today, there are very few surviving merchant tailors.

The second tailor to move in was of Jewish decent. When Mr Roberts acquired the premises over fifty years ago, he became the third tailor to carry out the trade of bespoke tailoring from the site on Selkirk Road.

Mr Roberts has now retired, however, the business continues to thrive under the management of his son, Joseph, and his experienced team.
